

Instructions for In-Person Services, Rev. 1-18-22

INDOOR SERVICES

- Due to the rapid spread of Covid variants in our area, the Church Council continues to request that everyone wear masks during worship services and when inside the building. If you are not fully vaccinated, masks and social distancing are required.
- Services will be held at 10 AM.
- Hand sanitizer is available next to each entrance.
- Go to the Narthex where the greeters will give you a bulletin and communion elements.
- Offering can be put in the plate at the back of the Sanctuary as you enter or leave.
- You may sit where you wish.
- Please remain in pews for the sharing of the peace and communion.
- Music will be provided by Daniel and hymns will be sung by choir members and the congregation. Anyone who sings must wear a mask.
- After the service dispose of communion cups in the trash receptacle as you leave and recycle the bulletin for reuse if you don't wish to keep it.
- For those who feel they need to stay home, you may attend the online Peace and Hope service at 10 am or 7 pm on Sundays.
- Folks that do not feel comfortable with indoor services, may listen to the service in the parking lot on FM 88.9.

Additional Information

- Per CDC recommendations, if you are in a high-risk group (people of any age with a serious underlying medical condition), or if you are not ready for crowds, you are encouraged to stay home and watch the Peace and Hope service.
- Before coming to church, ask yourself and others in your family the following:
 - Have you or anyone in your household had a fever in the past two weeks?
 - Do you or anyone in your household have a new cough or new shortness of breath?
 - Have you or anyone in your household come into contact in the past two weeks with anyone who is positive with COVID-19?

If you answer yes to any one of these three questions, please do not come to church but instead watch the Peace and Hope service.

- The Nursery will not be available for the time being, but parents can take children to the Fellowship Hall during church.
