

# **Neighborhood Development**

Snyder & Associates, general contractor, is preparing a plan for developing the 133 acre parcel surrounding the St. Michael property and extending to the Heathwood neighborhood. This area is commonly known as Kipps Farm. Earlier in the year, Snyder & Associates asked the Blacksburg Town Council to alter the town's Comprehensive Plan to allow higher density of dwellings on this 133 acres – from one per acre to four per acre. That request was denied by the Planning Commission and Town Council; Snyder & Associates is now working on an alternative proposal for single-family and townhome units. For the past several months, the long range planning team has been working to gather information about the St. Michael family and the areas surrounding St. Michael. In Blacksburg and Montgomery County, we have looked at the total population based on gender, diversity, age, and income. In our St. Michael family, we have looked at age groups, family make-up, housing locations, and changes in baptized membership. All of this information will be shared with you in an upcoming newsletter.

As we look at the long range planning process, the next step is to take a close look at our mission statement. Our current mission statement, which is included in the newsletter, is rather lengthy and something that we are probably not very aware of. As a congregation, how can we work towards our mission if we do not know what it is? To take a closer look at our mission statement and possibly make changes in it, we need the help of the entire congregation. On Sunday, September --, we will be focusing on our mission statement throughout the service. At the conclusion of the service, we will be asking everyone to contribute their thoughts and ideas about what St. Michael is really about and what our mission should be. During the next few weeks, please take some time to think about St. Michael and jot down any words or ideas that you think are important about our church. Please bring these ideas and comments with you on Sunday, September --. If you are unable to attend that Sunday, please share your ideas with a member of the long range planning team. Without you, this process cannot be successful.
