On August 24, we celebrated St. Bartholomew Day in worship. Who was St. Bartholomew? The Bible tells us little about him. We know he was one of Jesus' original 12 disciples because his name appears on lists in Matthew, Mark, and Luke's gospels. Many believe that Nathanael is another name for Bartholomew in the gospel of John. John's Nathanael uttered the familiar words, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" after he was told by Philip that Jesus was the promised Messiah. Jesus' recognition of Nathanael as a good and faithful Israelite transformed Nathanael into one of Jesus' followers. That's about all the Bible has to say about Bartholomew/Nathanael. But perhaps it is enough – just the right amount of information for us to identify with Nathanael as an "ordinary" disciple of Christ.

Most of us are "ordinary" disciples, set down in "ordinary" places with "ordinary" jobs and "ordinary" lives. The beauty of God's plan is that each of us, like Nathanael, has a role to play through the ordinariness of our lives. In *Make Me an Instrument of Your Peace*, Kent Nerburn writes, "Our lives are lived in the quiet corners of the ordinary. We build tiny hearth fires, sometimes barely strong enough to give up warmth. But to the person lost in the darkness, our tiny flame may be the road to safety, the path to salvation."

What an awesome thought! The light of Christ, which burns in me as a tiny flame, might be bright enough to shine the way for someone overcome by the darkness! It makes being ordinary suddenly seem a privilege – an honor bestowed by God. In the days and weeks ahead, be on the lookout for someone who seems to be lost in the darkness. You won't have to look far; it will be someone you encounter in the ordinariness of your days. Let the shine of Christ shine through you to give hope to the one you meet. And thank God for the privilege of being an "ordinary" disciple of Christ.

# Let's Pave the Parking Lot

## A new adventure for our congregation....

Q: Why? It's already paved.

A: Our parking lot is aging poorly; cracked, crumbling and buckling asphalt, weeds growing through the cracks.

Q: Can't we just resurface it – like I did my driveway last year?

A: All the paving experts agree that we would only cover up the problem temporarily and would spend more money in the long term in continuing maintenance.

O: What's the cost?

A: \$25,000

Q: Yikes!!

A: That's not a question.

Q: O.K. - why so much?

A: Again, all the experts agree we have to start over and redo the entire lot...not just patch it up.

Q: How will the congregation support the project?

A: Pledges will be taken in amounts of \$1,000, \$500, \$250, \$100 and \$50 (though any amount is welcome) which will correspond to sections of the lot. We will be able to watch the progress of our pledges as we "fill in" sections of the parking lot.

Q: Do I have to pay my pledge right away?

A: No, you'll have the opportunity to meet your pledge over a period of time – like the air conditioning project.

Q: I'm convinced. Where do I sign up?

A: Pledge cards will be available by Sunday, September 21. Thank you for making St. Michael Lutheran Church an attractive place for worship and fellowship.
