AN INVITATION TO PRAYER

Currently, St. Michael has three young people going through confirmation, the series of classes we ask young people to participate in to help prepare them to affirm the promises made at their baptism. Two of our young people, Scott and Robert, will be going with me to Confirmation Camp from July 10 through July 16 to learn more about their relationship with God.

During the week of July 10 through 16, I invite you to set aside a few extra moments each day to pray for Scott and Robert as they grow in their lives of faith. I also invite you to set aside a few extra moments to pray for all children and all newly baptized that they too might be surrounded by God's love and presence. If you're not sure what to pray, I'd suggest the prayer we use during the baptismal service:

God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we give you thanks for freeing your sons and daughters from the power of sin and for raising them up to a new life through Holy Baptism. Pour your Holy Spirit upon, Scott, Robert, all children and all the newly baptized: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence. Amen.

Prayer is powerful! I hope you will join me during the week of July 10 through 16 and pray for Scott, Robert, all children and all the newly baptized that they might know God's presence as they grow in their relationship with God.

New Flooring Coming In August

As a community of believers guided by the Holy Spirit, the mission of St. Michael Lutheran church is to:

Care for all God's people in need, Hear of God's love through Word and Sacrament Respond to God's grace with thankful hearts, Invite others into Christ's community, Serve God in our daily lives, and Tell the story of God's love for all. Thanks to your approval of the challenge project in the 2005 Spending Plan and your generous giving, St. Michael will replace the carpet in the sanctuary, the flooring in the narthex and hallways, and the flooring in the kitchen. The final decisions still need to be made on colors and styles, but work is scheduled to begin on the new flooring on August 23. Following worship on August 21, volunteers will be needed to remove the pews from the sanctuary and then on Saturday, August 27 volunteers will be needed to return the pews to the sanctuary for worship. Watch for sign up sheets in the weeks to come.

If you would like to make a gift to help with the cost of the new flooring, just place it in the offering plate and note, "New Carpet" on the memo line or on the envelope. With your help, we are being good stewards of the facilities God has given us and opening the door to support new and expanded ministries.
