WE ARE THE CHURCH TOGETHER

The Churchwide Assembly of the ELCA will meet in Orlando, Florida from August 8 through August 14. The purpose of the Assembly is to conduct the business of the national church. The Voting Members of the Assembly, including Pastor Terrie Sternberg from Pulaski and at least 9 others from Virginia, will hear reports on the ministry of the church and consider recommendations on a range of topics from new worship resources to sexuality to an agreement with the United Methodist Church. Undoubtably, issues of sexuality will receive the most publicity, but my hope is that the issues of sexuality that the Assembly will deal with will not completely overshadow the wonderful ministry that the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is doing.

Twice this summer, I have had the opportunity to listen to Presiding Bishop Mark Hansen speak about the ministry of the ELCA that he sees each day in his call as Bishop. He spoke of the millions of people helped by Lutheran Social Services organizations across the country. He spoke of the joy he shared with new mission congregations as they began gathering for worship. He spoke of the witness and faithfulness of Lutheran Men in Mission and the Women of the ELCA and he shared his commitment to the full communion agreements we share with other Christian denominations. While you and I may only see what happens in Blacksburg and in Virginia, Bishop Hansen made it clear that the people of the ELCA are making Christ known in exciting and life changing ways around the country.

I hope you will take a few moments each day during the Assembly to pray for:

>Presiding Bishop Hansen that he might have wisdom and faithfulness in leading the Assembly.

> the voting members to the Assembly, that they might be guided by the Holy Spirit,

right and for the ministry of the ELCA, that we may continue to share the good news of Jesus

We are the church together and although all of us cannot be in Orlando, your prayers will mean a great deal to those gathered there for the Assembly.
