Last month, the ELCA met in Assembly in Orlando, Florida to handle the business of the church. The Assembly approved the work of the Renewing Worship Taskforce, which is developing new worship resources for congregations, affirmed our current standards for ordination and approved an interim sharing agreement, which is the first step in reaching full communion with the United Methodist Church. Thank you for joining me in praying for the Assembly as they sought to follow God's will for the ELCA.

One of the many ways that we are the church together is through Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR). Lutheran Disaster Response is a collaborative ministry of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. On their behalf, LDR responds to disasters in the United States and its territories to deliver services to survivors and the impacted community throughout all stages of the disaster response (emergency, relief and long-term recovery). After seeing the pictures coming from the Gulf Coast, it is obvious that LDR will be providing assistance to the people of Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama for the indefinite future.
