The American Indian Ministry: Shoe boxes and Beds

In October, the WELCA members at St. Michael will be encouraging our congregation to fill shoe boxes (or similar size boxes) for children in the Head Start program on the Pine Ridge Indian reservation in South Dakota. Items for the boxes could include mittens, caps, pencils, crayons, coloring books, books, toys, toothbrush and toothpaste, shampoo. Plastic shoe boxes are available at church or you can use your own box. The Women of the ELCA will wrap your box for you if desired



– and we'll even do your shopping for you if you'd like to donate \$15. A box can be filled for \$10-\$15 – especially if you shop at the dollar stores.

The reservation is located in the poorest county in the United States, where family income averages \$3,700 and unemployment is 93%. Many families live in tents or old cars. For many of the children, our shoe box gifts may be their only Christmas gifts.

As part of the American Indian Ministry, we will also be sponsoring a **bed project** for the reservation. We will encourage the congregation to donate funds for a bed and bedding for one family. Offering envelopes for the bed project are in the pews. The Christmas boxes and bed donations will be brought to the annual Fall Gathering on October 23 at Trinity Lutheran Church in Pulaski.
