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Caring and Sharing

One strength of the ministry of St. Michael is the way we both care for our family and share our gifts with people in need. In March, we will begin two new projects which will enhance and expand the caring and sharing of St. Michael.

Caring - One way that we care for our congregational family is to offer support and prayers following the death of a family member. In the past, we have tried to call as many people as possible when a death occurs, but inevitably, someone gets missed. To make sure that this information gets out in a timely fashion, we will now send out a *Remember in Your Prayers* email that includes information about the visitation and funeral. If you don't have email or would not like to receive this information in an email, then we will have a group of *Caring Callers* who will phone those who have signed up to be called in these situations. If you would like to be a Caring Caller or would like to received a phone call to inform you of a death in the congregation, please sign up on the *Welcome* sheet in the bulletin.

Sharing - For the last several years, St. Michael has been partnered with Soi Lutheran Church in Papua New Guinea. We have prayed for their ministry and have seen pictures from Karen Mayer's visit with the congregation. Thanks to the efforts of the Virginia Synod, we now have the opportunity to share our resources with the church in Papua New Guinea by supporting the Virginia Synod Youth to Youth Project. This project will help build a *New Guinea Islands District Office Ministry Complex* to provide office space, housing for youth and women when they gather for district events and a guest house for visitors. The Council has decided to designate our 2006 Midweek Lenten Offerings to support this wonderful project. Proposed Constitutional Amendment

Over the past year, the Congregational Council has been working on a proposed amendment to the Church Constitution which will make it easier to conduct the daily business of the church. The current constitution allows the council to spend up to \$500 more than a line item in the spending plan without congregational approval. The \$500 figure has not been adjusted since it was adopted when St. Michael was formed in 1970. In today's world where an emergency repair of a roof or heating system could easily exceed \$500, the existing cap creates potential problems for our ministry together. In addition, the current constitution makes no provision to limit the number of line items and thus actually allows an additional \$500 to be spent in each of our over 60 line items.

To correct this problem, the Congregational Council proposed the following amendments which will create an overall spending limit, provide more flexibility for the council in dealing with emergencies and new ministry opportunities, and make it clear that these additional funds can only be spent if they have already been given. The council will be able to spend up to a total of 10% more than the approved spending plan without congregational approval. No individual expenditure within that 10%, however, may exceed 5% of the approved spending plan. This will allow for larger single expenditures than the current constitution, but will cap the total extra spending much sooner than the current constitution. Below you will see both the existing section of the constitution and the proposed amendment. If you have any questions about this proposal, please talk to any council member or Pastor John.

Existing C12.05.c. The Congregation Council may enter into contracts of up to \$500 for items not included in the budget without the approval of the congregation.

Proposed C12.05.c The Congregational Council may enter into individual contracts of up to five (5)% of the total approved current budget for items not included in the budget provided the expenditure does not require borrowing additional funds. The Congregational Council, with the approval of the congregation, may enter into contracts % of more than five (5) of total approved the current budget.

Existing C12.05.d. The Congregational Council shall prepare an annual budget for adoption by this congregation, shall supervise the expenditure of funds in accordance therewith following its adoption, and may incur obligations of more than \$500 in excess of the budgeted line item only after approval by a Congregational Meeting. The budget shall include this congregation's full indicated share in support of the wider ministry being carried on in partnership with the synod and churchwide organization.

Proposed C12.05.d. The Congregational Council shall prepare an annual budget for adoption by this congregation, shall supervise the expenditure of funds in accordance therewith following its adoption, and may incur total obligations in excess of ten (10) % of the approved current budget only after approval by a Congregational Meeting. The budget shall include this congregation's full indicated share in support of the wider ministry being carried on in partnership with the synod and churchwide organization.
