We Are Easter People!

I love Easter! Easter is my favorite Sunday of the church year because on Easter morning we are reminded that we are Easter people. We celebrate the empty tomb and the risen Lord. We rejoice at the grace of God, the unconditional, undeserved love, mercy, and forgiveness that God shows us in Jesus. We embrace the hope and promise of eternal life with God that Easter brings. We are Easter people!

Even as we gather on Palm Sunday and throughout Holy Week, we are Easter people. If we weren't, we would be overwhelmed by the "Hosannas" turning to shouts of "Crucify Him!". We would be lost at the thought of one of Jesus' own disciples betraying him. We would be devastated by the sadness of Good Friday. Easter Sunday will come and go before we know it, but the good news for you and for me is that thanks to Christ's death and resurrection, we are Easter people freed from the power of death by God's gracious love.
