Wordshops and the Book of James

I'm convinced that God is calling God's people to a life of discipleship - a life of following Jesus. This life of discipleship begins in the waters of baptism and continues to grow and change throughout our lives. As a congregation, God calls us to be the place where God's people are equipped for this life of following Jesus. To begin to answer this call to discipleship more fully, I will begin teaching a series of classes called *WORDshops* and begin a sermon series on the Book of James.

Tools for a Life of Faith *WORDshops* offer practical tips and ideas for growing in your relationship with God. Each *WORDshop* will focus on an aspect of a life of faith. The **first** *WORDshop* will be on Prayer on Wednesday, September 13, followed by Giving on October 11 and Service on November 8. *WORDshops* on Reading the Bible, Nurturing Relationships and Worship will take place on January 10, February 7 and March 7. You are invited to come for a light supper at 6 PM and the *WORDshop* will run from 6:30 p.m. until 7:30 p.m.. Child care is provided. The *WORDshops* are based on the book "Real Faith for Real Life" by Pastor Mike Foss. If you are interested in learning more about any of the tools discussed in the *WORDshops*, you can borrow a copy of the book from the church. Sign up on the "Welcome" form or talk to Pastor John for more information.

On Sunday, September 3, I will begin a five week **sermon series** based on our reading from the Book of James. The series entitled "Beyond Belief" will focus on deepening our lives of faith and growing in our response to God's love for us. A series of daily and weekly devotional materials on James will be available at worship each week to help you continue your focus on James.

New Red Hymnals



At the last ELCA National Assembly, the church approved a new hymnal for ELCA congregations. Unlike previous hymnals that provided all new resources, the new Evangelical Lutheran Worship Hymnal (ELW) seeks to combine current resources and new resources into one hymnal. The new ELW Hymnals will be available in October and the Council has approved purchasing them for St. Michael.

- LBW Setting I and Setting II are included in the ELW which means we will not need to learn new service music.
- The ELW contains 189 of the 209 hymns we have used over the last two years. Of the 20 hymns not included in the new hymnal, only 9 are recognizable hymns and we have a copyright license that will allow us to continue to use those hymns in worship.
- With the ELW we will no longer have to shuffle two worship books and it will free up space to place Bibles in the pew racks.
- We will be keeping all of the WOV Hymnals and about 30 of the LBW, but anyone who gave an LBW in memory or in honor of someone is invited to take that hymnal home once the new hymnals arrive.
- The hymnals will be paid for by a combination of individual donations and existing memorial funds.
- The cost for a hymnal is \$17.50 (after October 2 the cost will be \$20). If you would like to purchase a hymnal for your personal use, you can do so through the church. A Hymnal Order form is in the Sunday bulletin.

Blessing of the Animals on October 1 at 3 PM

The Blessing of Animals is generally held on October 4, the day that the church remembers St. Francis of Assisi or somewhere near that date.
