Serving - If you look carefully at the October Servants on the back of the newsletter, you will notice three new opportunities for service at St. Michael. We are adding a Youth Servant each Sunday. These youth help pick up bulletins and straighten the sanctuary after worship. In addition to the youth servants, we now have Greeters and Worship Assistants at the 9 AM Service. Women of the ELCA

Remember the Women's Resource Center: We will be collecting items for babies, though any donation of personal health care items and cleaning supplies is always welcome.
