Along with seven other congregations in the New River Conference, we provided over 100 shoebox gifts. Additional offerings of \$300 for postage were also donated.



St. Michael will have a congregational brunch and meeting on Sunday, December 10 at 10 a.m. to approve the Spending Plan for 2007, elect new council members, and to consider both constitutional amendments and a constitutional bylaw. Proposed Constitutional Amendment to Establish Mission Endowment Fund

The Council is recommending several amendments to the constitution to allow St. Michael to establish a Mission Endowment Fund. The purpose of the mission endowment fund will be to provide for mission work beyond the operating budget of the congregation in the following areas of ministry: Youth and Family Ministry, Caring and Sharing Outreach Ministry, Music Ministry, Major Maintenance and Improvement, and Scholarship Funds to include the Gallimore Scholarship. The exact wording of the proposed amendment will be available following the November Council meeting.

Proposed Constitutional Bylaw to Protect Historic Cemetery

The council is recommending that the congregation adopt a new constitutional bylaw to protect the historic cemetery on the church grounds. The small cemetery behind the sanctuary dates back to the original Lutheran Church that sat on the property in the 1800s and is a part of the history of the area. To ensure that the cemetery remains historic, the council recommends closing the cemetery to future burials by adopting bylaw C 16.05.

C 16.05 In order to preserve the historic nature of the cemetery on the grounds of St. Michael Lutheran Church, no further burials will be allowed on church property.

Bequest Received

An undesignated bequest has been received from the estate of Janet Bryant. As outlined in our Bequest Policy, the council tithed the gift and made contributions in memory of Janet to the Montgomery County Emergency Assistance Program and the Christmas Store. The Council is considering ways to use the remainder of the bequest to support the ministry of St. Michael. We give thanks to Janet for remembering St. Michael in her will.
