Giving Locally, Nationally and Internationally

When the Congregational Council met on Sunday, January 14, we received the joyous news that your generous giving had exceeded our spending in 2006 by over \$4500. As a way of giving thanks for your support of God's ministry at St. Michael, the Council decided to gift this money to help people in need by giving three gifts of \$1500 locally, nationally and internationally.

On the local level, the council transferred \$1500 to the Justice and Mercy Fund. The Justice and Mercy Fund provides assistance to people in our community who need help with things like power bills, water bills and rent. On the national level, the council authorized a \$1500 gift to Peace Lutheran Church in Slidell, Louisiana. I will deliver a portion of the money when I travel to Slidell for a mission trip in March. The rest will be given to help with the Virginia Synod's on-going support of their pastor, Barb Simmers. On the international level, the council gave \$1500 to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi. The check was presented to Bishop Byumbee when he and his wife spoke to the Women of the ELCA on January 18 and will in part provide food for hundreds of hungry children.

God has made us stewards of a variety of gifts. I give thanks for your generous stewardship of God's gifts to you and for the Council's wisdom, leadership and generosity.


A Thank You for the Christmas Gift Boxes

- For giving, contribute time or money to one additional cause or ministry you believe in.
