#### **Supporting Our Expanding Ministry**

On Sunday, March 11, the Congregation approved spending up to \$3000 to hire architects to develop specific possibilities for expanding our facilities to meet the growing educational needs of the St. Michael. The Facilities Expansion Task Force developed a list of ministry needs and identified several architects to be contacted. Over the last two weeks, four architects have agreed to be a part of the Architectural Study Process. Each architect will develop a set of preliminary design ideas and present their concept to the Task Force at a meeting on Saturday, May 19. The Task Force will use that information to make a recommendation to the Council about whether or not we should actively pursue expanding our facilities. The Council will then schedule a congregational meeting in early June to share the Task Force recommendations and get feedback from the congregation.

I am excited about the Architectural Study Process because it allows us to get concrete ideas and initial cost projections which will enable us to make good decisions about how to support the expanding ministry of St. Michael. The Facilities Expansion Task Force now includes Carol Bland, Jim and Judy Clemens, Cindy Dowdy, Dianne Krallman, Fran Shepherd, Don Linkous, Sharon Robinson, Carla Schwertz, Jody Smiley and Doug Viet. If you have any questions about the process we are undertaking or any ideas you would like to share, please talk to me or to one of them.

#### Filling Your Toolbox: Work from Rest, Not Rest from Work

Most people think about resting after a long week of work. When we look at Genesis, we discover that God calls us to find the energy for our work from our time of rest. After God created Adam and Eve on the sixth day and said be fruitful, the very next thing God instructed them to do was rest. Only after resting and spending time focusing on their relationship with God, did they begin to do the work God called them to do. In today's world, we often forget to make time to rest and focus on our relationship with God, but the good news we hear in Genesis and in the 10 Commandments is that rest is an important part of living a life of faith. **Tip:** As you look at the week ahead, write "REST" on your schedule as an appointment and honor that appointment with God just as you would any other appointment you make during the week.
