Facilities Expansion Update

The Facilities Expansion Task Force and our architect, Tom Koontz, have been hard at work and have made significant progress in the last few months. On January 31, we submitted our Special Use Permit to the Town of Blacksburg requesting approval for our Master Site Plan (on display in the Fellowship Hall). The Town has been in communication with us and has selected Friday, March 7 at 6 p.m. for the community Following that meeting, our site plan will be reviewed by the Planning meeting. Commission and considered at their public meeting on April 1 at 7:30 p.m.. Hopefully, our request will then be considered by the Town Council in May. Once the Special Use Permit was filed, we were able to request information from the County Health Department concerning our septic system and what action will be required to handle our future growth. We have also begun contacting possible contractors to determine their interest in the project and to obtain their assistance in projecting a more accurate cost for the project. In addition, new special fund offering envelopes have been ordered and will soon be available for those of you who would like to use an envelope for your gift to the Facilities Expansion Fund.

Even with all those steps underway, there are still many decisions to be made before any building could begin. In the coming months, the Facilities Expansion Task Force and Congregational Council will be providing you with an estimated cost for the project, details on any financing necessary to complete the project and a recommendation to the congregation on whether or not to proceed with construction. Thank you for your generous support of the ministry of St. Michael and the work of the Facilities Expansion Task Force. Together we are growing God's ministry at St. Michael.

Justice and Mercy Fund and the Kroger Cares Program

In 2007, we served 74 families through the Justice and Mercy Fund. We assisted our neighbors with water and electric bills, rent payments, medical expenses, clothing and other needs. To supplement our offerings to the fund, St. Michael formed a partnership with Kroger in 2005. Twenty-five members of the congregation purchased "Kroger Cares Gift Cards" for an initial investment of \$25, redeemable at any Kroger store. Supporters add value to their cards by recharging or "reloading" the value of the card up to \$500 at any time at any Kroger Store. Five percent (5%) of all card purchases and "reloads" are credited to the Justice and Mercy account when our account reaches \$5,000 or above. Since June, 2005, we have earned over \$2,200 for the fund.

The \$25 gift cards will again be available for purchase beginning Sunday, March 2.
