Facilities Expansion Recommendations on July 20

Over the last year, St. Michael has undergone a careful process to assess our current facilities, to determine what additional facilities are needed to support our growing ministry and to investigate the cost of adding the needed space. With the help of our architect, Tom Koontz, and input from the congregation, a Classroom Addition has been designed. The Classroom Addition will have seven new classrooms and new restrooms. The new classrooms will provide enough space for existing ministries, like Sunday School, and allow for future ministry growth. In addition to the classrooms, we plan to add a new playground and a new free standing storage building. The construction documents for the proposed addition are now in the hands of our contractor, Lionberger Construction, and they are beginning to estimate the cost for construction. After getting feedback from Lionberger, the Council will make a recommendation to the congregation about how to proceed. The recommendation will be considered at the Congregational Meeting on July 20 at 10 a.m. The congregation will receive an update on the progress of the project and any recommendations from the Council on Sunday, July 13 during the "Second Sunday" Summer Brunch.
