Education Celebration on September 7 at 9:50 AM: Groundbreaking to Kick-Off New Sunday School Year

Students will have an opportunity to meet their new teachers, everyone will have an opportunity to take part in the service to officially begin work on our new classroom building and then we will have time to share in fellowship and refreshments. I hope you will be able to take part in this celebration of a new year and new space for Christian education at St. Michael.

Growing with Faith Update

Once the congregation had unanimously approved construction of the "Phase 1 - Classroom Addition" on August 17, the Facilities Expansion Task Force and Council began working on the details that will allow us to begin construction. Our engineers have submitted a site plan to the Town of Blacksburg and they are working through the site plan process with the Town. Lionberger Construction has officially applied for a building permit from the Town of Blacksburg and is preparing to begin construction as soon as the permit is granted. The paperwork for our loan with Thrivent is nearly complete, so we should be able to schedule the closing on our loan in the near future. We received notice from the Town of Blacksburg that they have approved our request to connect to the County's water line, so we are now working with the County to have them install a meter for our new service. I look forward to seeing construction begin and to the expanded ministry the classroom addition will support.

Care of Creation Toolbox

Recycling is one way to take good care of our precious earth. Blacksburg recycling customers may now recycle mixed paper and commingled containers curbside. Please refer to the following guidelines:

- **Mixed paper**: All clean, dry paper that can be torn including newspaper, cardboard, office paper, magazines and catalogs, junk mail, phonebooks, paperboard (cereal boxes, shoe boxes, etc.); construction paper, colored paper, envelopes with and without windows, tissue and wrapping paper.
- **Cardboard**: must be no larger than 3'x3'. Please cut larger pieces to this size. Place cardboard that will not fit in the bin underneath the bin.
- **Items not accepted**: items with food residue, plastic padded envelopes, waxy or laminated paper, food-to-go-boxes, carbon paper, paper towels, tissues, used paper plates and cups and hardback books.

Christian Children's Fund (CCF)
