Micah's Backpack

"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

- Micah 6:8

St. Michael has a passion for feeding the hungry. The Community Thanksgiving Meal is an established ministry which reaches well over 120 people per year. The people of God at St. Michael have donated food to local food banks for years and have responded to a variety of hunger related needs. Our participation in the SHARE Program allows nearly 40 families a month to purchase food at more reasonable prices.

As Pastor Glenn London noted during his sermon at our 40th Anniversary Celebration, now is the time to take the next step forward in ministry. Now is the time to build upon our passion for feeding people and to begin providing direct assistance to children in our community through a backpack feeding program. Backpack feeding programs are designed to help hungry children at times, such as weekends, when other resources like meals served at school are unavailable.

Micah's Backpack will be a community ministry sponsored by St. Michael which will provide a backpack filled with two breakfasts, two lunches and two dinners to a child in need. Beginning on Friday, November 7, St. Michael will provide backpacks to five students identified by Price's Fork Elementary. The students will return the backpacks on Monday to be refilled for the coming weekend. If you would like to donate items, the list follows. Each basket usually costs around \$20, so monetary donations are accepted (checks payable to BHS). Basket list: 2 cans green beans or peas, 2 cans yams or sweet potatoes, 2 cans corn, I can cranberry sauce, 1 box stuffing mix, 2 packages biscuit or cornbread mix, 1 box instant mashed potatoes, 1 bag rice, 1 package pie crust mix (no frozen or prepared crusts), 1 can pumpkin, apple or berry pie filling, 1 box family-sized tea bags, 1 box hot chocolate mix, 1 small bag of sugar, 1 small bag of self-rising flour, 1 packet gravy mix, 2 cans of cream of mushroom soup, 1 can of chicken or beef broth. The items can be delivered to Blacksburg High School (520 Patrick Henry Drive) beginning at 8 a.m. on Monday, November 24.
