Do you have a favorite number? I'd like to share a few of the numbers I'm thankful for at the moment.

4, 5 and 10

Four is the number of weeks that our new feeding ministry, Micah's Backpack, has been running and it is off to a great start. Five is the number of students Micah's Backpack is helping each week. Ten is the approximate cost per week to provide a backpack of food for a child and ten is also the total number of children we plan to serve on a weekly basis when the ministry expands to include Kipps Elementary in 2009.

100 and 400

One hundred is approximately how many people attended the first St. Michael and St. Mary's Thanksgiving Service. It was wonderful to join in worship and give thanks for our blessings with our new neighbors. Four hundred is approximately how much money was given at the service to support the Montgomery County Emergency Assistance Program.

One hundred and thirty is the number of people who shared in the Community Thanksgiving Meal. The food was wonderful. The spirit was joyful. It was a marvelous day!

There were about *forty* people who participated in the Party with a Purpose and they prepared *two hundred and twenty* Christmas Boxes for shipping to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation thanks to the overwhelming generosity of people at St. Michael and our other local partners in ministry.
