God's Stories for Today

Have you ever wanted to learn more about the Bible and some of the great stories of scripture? Beginning on May 3, you'll have that chance as St. Michael begins a year long emphasis called, *God's Stories for Today*. In worship each Sunday, we will focus on one major story from scripture ranging from the Creation Story on May 3 to the Call of Samuel on July 19 to the Great Commission on February 14, 2010. The entire list of readings for the year is available on our website.

To make this emphasis possible, you will see one small change in worship. Since *God's Stories for Today* will emphasis entire scripture stories instead of several different shorter passages, we will use one main reading and one complementary reading in worship, instead of having three scripture readings plus a Psalm each week. With this change, we will no longer be using bulletins with our scripture readings printed on the back. You are invited to bring your favorite Bible to worship or to use one of the Bibles in the pew to follow along with the reading.

In addition to focusing on God's stories in worship, we will also spend time studying these passages outside of worship through Sunday School and Bible studies. This summer we will offer classes on reading and interpreting scripture. If you have any other ideas for how we might more fully connect God's stories to today's world, please let me know. I look forward to beginning the exploration of scripture with you in May.

In fact, Kathy stated that we are a "model" program and she often sends new volunteers to our site to observe. **Our thanks to Betty and Burn Gross, Wanda and James Pascoe and Sam and Jenny Akers for nurturing SHARE for many years.** As we seek to strength and expand the SHARE ministry at St. Michael, we will need to expand the number of volunteers assisting with the program. For example, if you have just one Saturday morning a year to give, you could assist with picking up and delivering the food. Others volunteers are needed to assist with the administration of the program and will assist Betty and others on-site.
