A Sample Recipe from *FEEDING THE FLOCK COOKBOOK*

OLD-FASHIONED POTATO SALAD – by Betty Gross, Cookbook Chair

8 Ig. red skinned potatoes6 to 8 hard-cooked eggs, chopped6 to 8 ribs celery, chopped1 sm. onion

1 Tbs. sugar
¼ to ½ cup sweet pickle relish
1 to 1-1/2 cup mayonnaise
Salt and pepper to taste

Boil potatoes in water to cover until tender. Drain and cool. Peel and cut into bite-sized cubes. Add celery and mix until well blended. Add sugar to relish and let stand until sugar is dissolved. Add to potatoes along with eggs. Add mayonnaise and mix well. Add more mayonnaise until you get the consistency you desire. Season. Chill at least 1 to 2 hours to blend flavors. If a mild mayonnaise is used (such as Hellmann's or Kraft), add the juice of a small lemon. If a southern recipe mayonnaise is used (JFG or Duke's), no lemon juice is needed.
