God's Work, Our Hands: Micah's Backpack

Thanks to your generosity and support, Micah's Backpack is making an impact in our community by providing weekend meals to 16 children in need during the school year. In the fall, we plan to provide weekend meals to 30 children in need and hope to be in partnership with all five Blacksburg Elementary Schools. Now that our first year is finished, I wanted you to see the impact Micah's Backpack is making.

Here are the results of Micah's Backpack first year of ministry.

- 3 elementary schools participate
- 16 students participate
- 298 backpacks of food were sent home
- 1,788 meals provided
- \$5,783.80 in donations
- \$2,873.05 in food expenditures
- \$9.64 cost per backpack per week
- 12 supporting ministry partners including schools, other churches and local businesses
- 6,000 volunteer hours packing, transporting backpacks, meeting, and planning



A New Piano for Worship

After three months of searching, the Council decided to purchase a new Kawai CA 51 electronic piano to support the worship life of the congregation. We explored a number of options including new and used grand pianos, but ultimately decided that the Kawai CA 51 offered us the best sound quality at the most affordable price. Not only was the electronic piano more affordable, but it never requires tuning and thus reduces the long-term cost of ownership. Between Memorial gifts and designated gifts, we had two-thirds of the cost of the piano on-hand, so the Council decided to move ahead with the purchase and fund the remaining third of the cost through additional designated gifts and the Property Improvement line in the Spending Plan. As you have experienced, the new piano is a wonderful addition to our ministry and will serve us well for years to come.
