# Thanksgiving Baskets at Blacksburg High School

Basket list: 2 cans green beans or peas, 2 cans yams or sweet potatoes, 2 cans corn, I can cranberry sauce, 1 box stuffing mix, 2 packages biscuit or cornbread mix, 1 box instant mashed potatoes, 1 bag rice, 1 package pie crust mix (no frozen or prepared crusts), 1 can pumpkin, apple or berry pie filling, 1 box family-sized tea bags, 1 box hot chocolate mix, 1 small bag of sugar, 1 small bag of self-rising flour, 1 packet gravy mix, 2 cans of cream of mushroom soup, 1 can of chicken or beef broth. The items can be delivered to Blacksburg High School (520 Patrick Henry Drive) beginning at 8 a.m. on Monday, November 23.
