Many Hearts and Hands and Voices In Ministry Together

While most of us are aware of the ministry that goes on at St. Michael, it can be difficult to see the ministry that your generosity enables the larger church to undertake in our name. Here are a few example of the ministries that you support through the Virginia Synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

- Approximately 1000 youth from around Virginia participate in weekend retreats
 and faith building events led Assistant to the Bishop Dave Delaney. Virginia has
 one of the strongest Synodical youth ministry programs in the country.
- The ELCA supports 260 missionaries in 50 countries and maintains relationships with Lutheran bodies around the world. The Virginia Synod provides support to the Lutheran Church in Papua, New Guinea, including our sister church, Soi Lutheran.
- Each year, Lutherans give approximately 20 million dollars to the ELCA World Hunger program. Of those gifts 72 % goes to international assistance, 10% goes to hunger education and advocacy, 8 % goes to administration, and 10% goes to Domestic Hunger grants, including the \$4000 awarded to Micah's Backpack.
- The ELCA, the 65 Synods and local congregations support 8 seminaries, 147 outdoor ministry programs and 187 campus ministry programs, including the Lutheran Student Movement at Virginia Tech.

Together, we are making a difference in Blacksburg, in Virginia, and around the world.

Help for Haiti

We are invited to prepare a Lutheran World Relief Health Kit for our Haitian neighbors. Each kit should contain:

one hand towel (dark color recommended)

one washcloth (dark color recommended)

one bath-size bar (4 to 5 oz.) of soap in its original wrapping

one adult-size toothbrush in its original packing

one sturdy comb, remove packaging

one metal nail file or nail clippers with file attached, remove packaging

six band-aids, preferably $\frac{1}{2}$ " – $\frac{3}{4}$ ", secure together with a rubber band.

Please do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap smaller items in the washcloth; wrap washcloth and remaining items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags. **Bring the kits to St. Michael by February 14 and they will be shipped from the church. What a perfect "gift of love"!**
