- 5 Blacksburg Area Elementary Schools and the Head Start Preschool as Partners
- 73 Students have received Backpacks
- 370 Volunteer Hours Donated
- 1097 Backpacks Delivered
- 6582 Meals Delivered
- 4003 Pounds of Food Donated
- 3313 Items of Food Donated

#### Deadline for the St. Michael Scholarship is April 25


Applications are invited for the St. Michael Scholarship. Members of Lutheran churches in Montgomery County are eligible to apply. The application is available on the church bulletin board.
