One of the joys of being a part of the larger church is our connection to other wonderful ministries around the state and around the country. Here are a few examples of the ministry we help support.

- I shared the story of Micah's Backpack at the Virginia Synod Assembly at a workshop which inspired other churches in Virginia to start similar programs. With the help of the Synod, Micah's Backpack is helping to fight hunger around the state.
- Micah's Backpack received a \$4000 ELCA Domestic Hunger grant in support of our feeding ministry. An article about Micah's Backpack will be featured in the fall *Lifelines* newsletter which is distributed to over 10,000 ELCA congregations.
- The Virginia Synod provides some of the best youth ministry programs in the country. Each year hundreds of Virginia youth grow in faith at these events. This summer three of our youth participated in the Junior High Servant Event at Virginia Beach.
- There are over 187 Lutheran campus ministry programs around the country. The Lutheran Campus Ministry at Virginia Tech is based at Luther Memorial and receives financial support from Luther Memorial, the ELCA, the Virginia Synod and St. Michael.

This is only a snapshot of the ministry being accomplished through the larger church. Your generosity and support makes ministry happen everyday around the state and around the country.


Happy-Go-Lucky Luncheons continue through the summer
