Strengthen, Enhance and Expand

I enjoy our Annual Congregational Meeting. It is a wonderful opportunity for us to share a delicious brunch, to look back at the ministry we have accomplished together during the previous year and to look ahead to future ministry possibilities. The meeting is also the time when we receive our Annual Report. Thank you to everyone who contributes information for the report, especially Rick Mayer who gathers, edits and creates the Annual Report.

This year, we also discussed *Growing with Faith: Expanding God's Mission*, our capital campaign focused on renovation, debt reduction and future ministry. The group reviewed seven different possible projects and decided that providing start-up funding for a Special Needs Focused Mother's Morning Out or Preschool, replacing the Fellowship Hall Flooring, covering the exterior trim on the Sanctuary with vinyl and replacing the exterior doors would do the most to strengthen, enhance and expand the ministry of St. Michael. Those projects, combined with providing for the mortgage on the classroom addition and reduction of the principal of our loan, will all be addressed by *Growing with Faith: Expanding God's Mission*. Over the next few weeks, small groups will gather additional information about each of the projects which will be presented to the congregation on Sunday, March 27. If you are interested in helping research any of the projects, please let me know.
