Core Ministry Fund - A gift to the Core Ministry Fund supports the overall ministry of the congregation including craft supplies for Vacation Bible School, plates and cups for the Community Thanksgiving Meal and paper for the worship bulletins. As small as each of these items may seem, they are nevertheless crucial components of our learning ministry, our helping ministry and our worshiping ministry. Your generosity provides for these items and therefore makes ministry happen.

Facilities Expansion / Growing with Faith Fund - The classroom addition is crucial to the success of Micah's Backpack. Because we were able to create a beautiful new nursery in the classroom addition, storage for Micah's Backpack could move into the old nursery which in turn provided enough space for the program to expand from 65 backpacks per week to 150 backpacks per week. Your gifts to this fund not only reduce debt, support renovation projects and fund future ministries, they are vital to the ministry we are doing with our hearts and hands and voices each and every week.
