### Pastor John preaches the opening sermon at Synod Assembly



On June 3, Pastor John opened the 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Assembly of the Virginia Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) with a thoughtful sermon on the Ten Commandments. The annual meeting was held at Roanoke College with 417 ministers and lay leaders attending, including Jody Smiley, President of the Virginia Synodical Women's Organization (VSWO), and Ben and Carol Crawford representing St. Michael. The Reverend

Jim Mauney was re-elected Bishop on the first ballot. The Synod Spending Plan was presented to the Assembly by Pastor John and was passed unanimously. The 3-day meeting concluded June 5.
