God's Work, Our Hands

28 youth and 6 adults can pick a ton of tomatoes. There were probably 40 or 45 large plastic crates sitting by the side of the field and within an hour each of them was filled with tomatoes for the Food Bank. As I looked at the stack of crates, I was reminded what powerful work can be accomplished when God's people come together and use their gifts to serve God and one another. Our morning of gleaning was made possible because a farmer donated the produce from his field, a pastor made the calls to set up the project, a group of young people gave their time to pick vegetables and a driver from the food bank came to pick up the food. Without each person's willingness to share their gifts, this donation of food would not have been possible. As Paul says to the Corinthians, "there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Cor 12:4-7).

Each year, St. Michael works to create opportunities for God's people to use their gifts for the common good. You can get involved in short-term projects like the Community Thanksgiving Meal and the School Supply collection or long-term projects, like Micah's Backpack and the Justice and Mercy Fund. You can go on a summer mission trip or you can go visit a neighbor who is sick in the hospital. The key is to find the opportunity that best fits your gifts and passions and get involved. 
Happy-Go-Lucky Luncheon on Tuesday, August 16
