By my estimate, in 2011 the ministry of St. Michael has touched approximately 6,000 people with the good news of God's love which represents a 13% increase from 2010. The ministry of Micah's Backpack now feeds 196 students per week in Blacksburg and is supported by over 70 community partners. The first project in the Growing with Faith campaign was completed and new doors have been installed in the fellowship hall and front hallway. Planning for the next Growing with Faith project, a Special Needs Mother's Morning Out program is underway. Thank You!

From the musicians to the volunteers folding bulletins to those decorating the sanctuary, your willingness to share your time and talents makes all the worship services, meals and special projects happen. New Global Missionary Partnership in 2012



In 2012, St. Michael will begin a partnership with Pastor Austin Propst as he and his wife Tanya begin their service in Madagascar working with the ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program. Pastor Propst will work with The Malagasy Lutheran Church (MLC) in Madagascar which has 1800 congregations and 180,000 members. The Young Adults in Global Mission program allows 21 to 29 year olds "to engage one of the many dynamic ministries of the MLC in a manner that

will allow them to wrestle with the realities of economic justice in one of the poorest nations on earth, and the complexities of social dynamics in a country with significant but subtle ethnic diversity and deeply rooted spiritual beliefs and practices." Micah's Backpack



Micah's Backpack continues to feed children and youth who are our friends and neighbors in our community. For the 3 weeks in December before the school break, 196 students received gifts of weekend food. In December, 588 backpacks went out with over 3,500 meals in them. Partner groups and individuals donated nearly 2,700 food items! When a volunteer dropped off the last delivery for

December, the staff at one school commented on how much the children who participate look forward to their bags of food.
