Coming Soon: An Evening Worship Service

Would you like to help design, develop and attend a new evening worship service at St. Michael? On Monday, February 13 at 7 p.m. in the fellowship hall, a planning group will gather to begin work on an Evening Worship Service at St. Michael. This group will be building the service from the ground up, so bring your most creative ideas and dreams.

I realize at this point that you might be wondering, "Why does St. Michael need an evening service?" With changing work schedules and a multitude of commitments for individuals and families in today's world, the time is right to develop a worship opportunity for people who are unable to attend worship on Sunday mornings.

Over the next few months, the planning group will learn from those who will attend an evening worship service and seek to discover which night and time would work best. The group will develop the format and style of worship and explore ways to invite others to participate in this new service. The goal is for the new service to begin in September 2012, but the night, time and other details of the service will depend upon the needs of the people who will be attending the service. I am excited about this new beginning and about the opportunity to expand our ability to share God's love with our community.

Micah's Backpack January Report

Micah's Backpack ended the first month of 2012 feeding 191 children and youth in our community with gifts of weekend food. 777 bags went home providing 4,662 meals plus snacks. Volunteers donated almost 250 hours of time including youth who participated in community service to honor Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. In December and January, close to 7,100 food items were donated including 85 jars of peanut butter

Micah's Backpack will collect boxed fruit chews in February. Every month over 1600 snacks go home with hungry children and youth in their Micah's Backpack bag. Please put your gift of boxed fruit chews in the Micah's Backpack collection bin in the hallway. Thank you.
