#### Micah's Mobile Backpack and the Community Foundation

Each year when summer rolls around, people ask "How does Micah's Backpack help feed students in the summer?" and each summer, the various pilot programs we have tried have enjoyed limited success. As we evaluated each attempt, it became clear that a major hurdle to success was problems with transportation. With that problem in mind, Micah's Backpack applied for and received the 2012 Carolyn Pearsall White Community Impact Grant from the Community Foundation to start a new ministry called Micah's Mobile Backpack. The \$10,000 grant will allow Micah's Backpack to purchase and refurbish a bus for summer meal deliveries, and to develop a route in collaboration with families to ensure regular and effective delivery.

In announcing the grant, Jessica Wirgau, Executive Director of the Community Foundation, praised the work of Micah's Backpack and this new summer program. "Micah's Backpack," she said, "has had a tremendous impact in Blacksburg and continues to come up with creative ways to provide nutritious meals for children in need. We are so pleased to award our very first Community Impact Grant to Micah's Mobile Backpack." I am grateful to the Community Foundation for their generous support of Micah's Mobile Backpack and to all the partners who make the ministry of Micah's Backpack possible. It is only through the efforts of the hundreds of volunteers who pack food on Thursday nights, through the generosity of the people of St. Michael and other individual donors and through the support of approximately 100 community organizations that Micah's Backpack is able to provide weekend meals to 225 students per week in Blacksburg. Thank you!

#### Women of the ELCA



**Ladies' Night Out will be celebrated on Tuesday, October 2 at 6 p.m.,** at Famous Anthony's (in the back "banquet" room) at Gables Shopping Center – famous for ½ price burgers and hot dogs on Tuesday and other reasonably priced menu items. Join the sisters for fun and fellowship. This year, we will study the book *Kindred Sisters*, making connections between the lives and faith of women in the New Testament and contemporary

women of all ages. Gatherings of the Women of the ELCA will be held on the first Tuesday of the month during 2012-2013 (usually). The schedule is posted on the hallway bulletin board.

**Remember the Food Bank**: October is **cereal** month, though any kind of non-perishable food is always welcome.

**Remember the Women's Resource Center**: In October, we'll continue to collect paper supplies, e.g., toilet paper, paper towels. The collection basket is in the hallway.

In October, the WELCA members at St. Michael are encouraging our congregation to fill shoe boxes for Christmas for children in the Head Start program (ages 4-6) on the Pine Ridge Indian reservation in South Dakota. This gift box is often the only gift a child receives.

The contents of each box should be worth about \$15 (e.g., about 14-15 items from the Dollar Tree), including books and other educational items (especially those that help them with reading or arithmetic), crayons, pens, pencils, water colors, coloring books, toys (nothing that requires batteries, no toy guns), candy,



games, personal hygiene items like toothbrushes and toothpaste, warm hats, gloves, scarves, and socks. Boxes can also be filled for older children or adults, but in that case, please identify the box with an appropriate label, e.g., "teenage girl". These Christmas boxes will be sent to Rev. Karen Rupp, who oversees a homeless shelter on the reservation.



September started with a bang for Micah's Backpack. In the first three weeks of school we increased the number of children and youth fed by a little over 10% -- 221 children and youth received gifts of weekend meals and snacks in over 1,000 bags distributed this month.

Nine groups donated food from food drives including residents of Blacksburg who attended the first Cash Mob to include a non-profit collection. Friends gathered to support local downtown Blacksburg businesses and Micah's Backpack by bringing peanut butter and juice boxes to the gathering.
