Worship Changes During Lent

As we move through the seasons of the church year, the readings, music and elements of our worship services change to reflect the mood and emphasis of the season. Lent is a season of reflection and repentance, so you will notice that the style of music in worship becomes a little more somber and some of the celebrative elements of worship will be omitted until Easter. While none of these changes is major, hopefully each one will help set the mood for worship and heighten our awareness of God's presence in our midst.

Altar Care and Altar Flowers - the "inside story"



Each month, a St. Michael servant (or two) prepares the communion wine and wafers for the 11 a.m. communion service and other special mid-week services. This loving task, which involves less than an hour of time on the preceding Saturdays, may also require changing the altar cloths for the season or celebration. Only a little

training is required and anyone can serve. Those who provide altar care are not the "little old church ladies" we may envision in the traditional altar guild (though Opal and Pearl, the church "gems", have been known to fill a communion cup or two). A sign-up sheet is posted on the hallway bulletin board. See Sandy Birch if you have any questions.



Each Sunday, with the exception of the Lenten season, individuals or families provide altar flowers in honor of or in memory of loved ones or in celebration of a special event such as an anniversary. The dedication is noted in the Sunday bulletins. Church volunteers order the flowers from Angle Florist in Christiansburg using the sign-up list found on the front hallway bulletin board. Angle Florist delivers

the flowers on Saturday and an invoice is sent directly to the responsible family or individual. The cost of the two bouquets is \$31.50 which includes a delivery charge. The fresh flower bouquets adorn the front of the sanctuary at each of the three church services on Sunday and then are rearranged in a dozen or so smaller arrangements and delivered to Heritage Hall the following Monday for the enjoyment of its residents. Our Heritage Hall "flower crew" includes Alice Schneider, Lynn Hickock, Barbara Corbett, Sandie Worley and Sandy Birch.

Thank you to everyone who provides our beautiful altar flowers and who shares their time in preparing our altar for communion services. You are a blessing.
