Ministry with Youth This Summer: Sharing, Nurturing and Living

Each year, St. Michael kicks off the summer with a week of Vacation Bible School. We gather together from 6:15 p.m. until 8:15 p.m. to share a meal, music, crafts and stories. This year, our theme is Everywhere Fun Fair. We will have groups for youth from pre-school through 12th grade and I am particularly looking forward to working with our middle school and high school aged youth to develop and lead the opening and closing skits. It should be a wonderful week and I hope you will get involved.

Not long after Vacation Bible School ends, I will take a group of five middle school youth to Confirmation Camp at Lutherock in Newland, NC. During the week we will learn more about what it means to be connected to God's Word and to live out our faith. Our youth will be with thirty youth from other congregations around the southeast and will have the opportunity to explore nature and what it means to be a child of God.

At the end of the summer (July 28 - Aug. 2), I will lead a Middle School Mission Trip to Virginia Beach for all rising 7th, 8th and 9th graders. We will partner with other Lutheran youth to learn about homelessness and assist organizations that make a difference in the lives of others. If any youth and their friends are interested in going on the Mission Trip, please let me know.
