Over the next few months, we will begin looking for a new accompanist to play for our morning worship services. During the search, Patrice Yearwood will serve both as Music Director and accompanist. Patrice's ability to serve in the dual role affords us the opportunity to take our time and find the right person to be a part of our ministry team. Growing with Faith: Expanding God's Mission Update

In May 2011, St. Michael invited the congregation to support Growing with Faith, a three year project to support renovation, debt reduction and future ministries. Because of your generous support for Growing with Faith, St. Michael has been able to launch the Fun with Friends program for families of preschoolers with special needs, seal the parking lot, replace the exterior metal doors to the fellowship hall and front hallway, make our monthly mortgage payments and reduce the principal on our loan from \$567,312 on January 1, 2011 to \$459,518 on July 15, 2013. The next project to be completed is the installation of the new carpet in the fellowship hall which will begin on August 9.
