

Walking to Build a Whole Healthy Life

Walking is healthy, it reduces stress and helps us control our weight. Walking with a friend is fun. Walking keeps us limber and feeling good. Just 30 minutes of walking, three times a week will help us live longer, so the Older Kids would like to challenge the congregation to walk with us to Bethlehem this fall – well, not literally, but let's travel the 6,114 mile distance to Bethlehem.
