Which Way Do We Want to Go?

The first time we took the boys to Disney when they were old enough to tell us what they wanted to do, the options were a little overwhelming. When we entered the park, there were so many rides, so many shows, so many experiences, that they couldn't decide which way to go first. Without a clear consensus, we stood at the crossroads for a moment while we tried to make a choice.

As I talked with the Congregational Council several months ago about the future, we realized that in many ways we were standing at a crossroads and we needed help making a decision about which way we wanted to go. We are blessed to have an enormous number of ministry opportunities and possibilities before us. The new high school has opened in our backyard. Fifty to sixty new homes are planned for the land to the right of the church. We have more young children and teenagers connected to St. Michael than ever before. The question for us, therefore, is which way is God calling us to go and how should we invest the resources God has given us to achieve the most faithful results.

I invite you to come help us pick a direction and plan for the next steps in our ministry. On Friday, October 10 and Saturday, October 11, the entire congregation is invited to be a part of a planning retreat. With the help of Pastor David Derrick from St. Philip Lutheran Church in Roanoke, we will talk about who God is calling us to be, look at the ministry opportunities that are before us and discover the steps we need to take to grow and strengthen our ministry in the community and in the world. With your help, we'll pick a direction and begin taking the next steps in our ministry together.




hallway. We will be collecting the filled and unwrapped boxes through mid-November and on Sunday, November 23, during Sunday School, we will prepare the boxes for mailing.
