Developing Leaders, Maintaining Facilities

Last October, we began a process of evaluation and planning to determine the next best steps for growing and strengthening the ministry of St. Michael. A Life-long Faith Formation Task Force was created to identify ways to connect youth to Christ, to unite young adults around their faith, to equip parents to build faithful families, to convert faith into action in working adults and to connect seniors to one another and to God. After several months of work, the Task Force recommended that the congregation create a team of shepherds who would provide leadership and support for specific areas of ministry within the life of the congregation. The Congregational Council endorsed the idea and over the next few months, the Task Force will begin to develop the idea more fully. Watch for more specific information about how you can get involved in the months to come.

In addition to developing shepherding leaders for God's ministry at St. Michael, the Congregational Council is beginning to develop a plan to replace the roof on the sanctuary. After 25 years, the current roof is nearing the end of its useful life and needs to be replaced before we experience any water damage. A planning team will begin work on the project after Easter and hopefully bring a recommendation to the congregation for feedback and support within a few months. If you are interested in being a part of the team that looks at options for the new roof or if you have any questions, please let me know.
