New Worship Opportunity at St. Michael

Across the Spectrum is a worship and fellowship event inclusive of all people with all abilities and learning styles. This event was born out of a desire to provide a safe place of worship for people of all learning styles and persons on the autism spectrum, as well as their loved ones.

Across the Spectrum currently meets at Christ Lutheran Church in Radford and beginning in June will expand to St. Michael. This worship and fellowship event is led by Pastor Drew Tucker (Christ, Radford) and includes activities that provide multiple access points so that all people, regardless of ability, can find ways to engage God.

So, what does Across the Spectrum look like?

Multi-sensory stations that help to engage with more than just words, but pictures, sounds, smells, tastes, and textures.

Worship at your own pace in order to provide comfortable, accessible opportunities to learn more about God. There are no required activities, only an invitation to participate as God leads you.
