While I was at Confirmation Camp, I had the opportunity to speak with a few colleagues from Charleston, South Carolina about their experiences in the days following the shooting at Emmanuel AME Church. Initially, we compared notes about what it is like to do ministry in a community where a shooting has happened and what they could expect in the days and weeks to come. They then began to speak about their friend and classmate, Rev. Clementa Pinckney, and about the response of the local AME congregations and the Charleston community to the shooting.

As we talked, I learned about a pastor, a senator, a husband and a father who faithfully preached the Gospel and worked for the good of the whole community. I heard about the local AME congregations, who in response to the shooting, opened their church doors and welcomed all people to come together and pray for peace and unity. I heard stories of a community coming together, not to riot, but to grieve and to look for ways to move forward together.

In Galatians 3:28, Paul reminds us that in Christ "there is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." I know that racism, injustice and intolerance are generational problems that aren't overcome quickly, but I invite you to join me and the people in Charleston in praying that we, and all people, will see past the social and cultural characteristics that often divide us and instead treat one another as brothers and sisters united by God's love in one family of faith.
