Ministry Partnerships

As I look around the ministry landscape today, I see an extraordinary rise in the amount of ministry being accomplished through partnerships. For St. Michael, this is nothing new. From the SHARE cooperative food purchasing program, to the Community Thanksgiving meal, to our support of Campus Ministry at Virginia Tech, to Virginia Synod Youth Events, to the ELCA World Hunger Fund to the new Across the Spectrum Service, St. Michael has a long history of working with others to be God's heart and hands and voices in the world. In the Blacksburg community and in communities around the country, St. Michael is well known for sponsoring Micah's Backpack which claims over 200 partners and hundreds of individuals who give time and resources to feed hungry children in our community.

In August, we are entering into a new partnership that will expand our ministry to families and young children in our community. While there are still a number of hurdles to clear before everything is official, we are working with Total Action for Progress (TAP) and Rainbow Riders to launch an Early Childhood Head Start program at St. Michael for children from 6 weeks to 3 years old. This new program will serve families at or below the poverty line. Our goal is to address root causes of poverty by allowing parents to work or go to school and by providing early intervention and educational services to children who are at risk.

At the 2nd Sunday Summer Brunch on August 9, I will have an update on our progress in creating the partnership and more details about this exciting new program which will complement our existing Mother's Morning Out program and the Head Start for Preschool aged students at Blacksburg Presbyterian Church.

Micah's Backpack Sharing the Story

Thank you to everyone who made a gift during the Cummings & Ivers Challenge Gift period. We hit our goal two weeks early and raised \$2,050 toward our infrastructure needs!



Thank you to Heather Pettus for recommending Micah's Caring Initiative to her colleagues at Adobe. We received our second grant from the Adobe Employee Community Foundation. They sent a check for over \$11,000 to help us feed and clothe our friends and neighbors in need!



We shared 6 meals and snacks with approximately 170 kids every weekend in July! Our friends at 3 Birds Berry Farm hosted a mini-field trip for some of our kids at the end of the month. The teachers and brand new principals of Harding Avenue and Price's Fork Elementary Schools helped share books too!

Volunteers picked and shared over 260 pounds of blueberries from 3 Birds Berry Farm! The kids who visit the Mobile Backpack love them and often ask for them before they check out books or fill out the next weekend's menu.

Thank you to Hank Schneider and his colleagues at Long and Foster for supporting Micah's Backpack with two huge Kroger food drives, an in-house food drive, packing on Wednesday night, and harvesting in Micah's Garden.

During August, Micah's Backpack will continue to collect small jars of peanut butter for Peanut Butter from Heaven . Clean, intact plastic grocery bags are also needed too. Thanks.


In August, we will collect microwaveable mac and cheese.
