The Christmas Giving story continues....

It was noted in the December newsletter that we sent 276 Christmas shoeboxes to the Head Start children at the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Our good friends at a Dublin, VA shipping company called Fontaine, ship our boxes and those from Christ Episcopal at no cost — that's over 2,000 pounds of presents. What a wonderful gift from the company! In addition, we always have hats, gloves, scarves, baby blankets, toiletries and other items that we



send to a retreat center and clothing closet on the reservation. We always use Easy Way (near Taco Bell) who yearly give us a nice discount. This year the small donations from individuals and organizations to help with shipping totaled \$130. This amount was not mentioned to our friend at Easy Way as she calculated our cost. After the discount, the total came to \$132.14....which she rounded to 130...the exact amount that had been donated! A small Christmas miracle?

Remember the Food Bank: for January please bring in breakfast cereals – any variety, either cooked or dry cereals, though all donations of packaged and canned foods are greatly appreciated.

Remember the Women's Resource Center: Cleaning supplies will be collected during January.
