Giving Thanks and Looking Forward

As I prepare to conclude my ministry at St. Michael, I want to take the opportunity to say "Thank You!" Thank you for your willingness to share your gifts for ministry. Thank you for being God's heart, hands and voices in our community. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to be your pastor for the last 14 years. St. Michael is an extraordinary congregation filled with faithful, wonderful people. It has been my privilege to be in ministry with you! I look forward to celebrating our ministry together at the potluck on June 23rd and at my last worship services on June 24th.

While my ministry at St. Michael is drawing to a close, the ministry of the congregation will continue to be strong and vibrant. Here are a few helpful notes about the transition.

- The Congregational Council is working with the Synod to call an **interim pastor** to serve for the next year as the congregation moves through the call process. As soon as an interim is selected, the Council will share the news with the congregation.
- ► The **Call Process for an ELCA** congregation requires a number of steps. Bishop Humphrey has already met with the Council to talk about the future. Eventually, the Council will appoint a call committee which typically has a cross-section of the congregation with 7 to 12 people. The call committee will oversee completing the ELCA Ministry Site Profile (MRP), interview candidates and recommend a candidate to the Council. The Council will recommend a candidate to the congregation. At a called Congregational meeting, the congregation votes to call the new pastor. Given the vibrancy of the congregation, the size and the location, it seems likely that St. Michael will have numerous candidates interested in the call.
- ➤ What about weddings, baptisms and funerals? After July 1, I will no longer be the pastor at St. Michael and will no longer be available to preside at weddings, baptisms or funerals. If you call and ask me to do a wedding, baptism or funeral, I will have to say "no". It is not personal. It is not a reflection on how I felt about you when I was your pastor, but it creates an unhealthy dynamic within a congregation when a pastor resigns, but unofficially continues to be the pastor in the shadows.
