#### "Not Just 50, But 260!"

As we anticipate celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St Michael Lutheran Church, it is helpful to learn about our legacy that goes back, not just 50 years, but more than 260 years! There was a missionary by the name of Mr. Schnell (who was ordained a Lutheran pastor in 1751) who walked to the New River settlement from the Lutheran church in Hebron, Virginia, just north of Charlottesville.

From the diary of Missionary Schnell of 1749:

"I had difficulty finding my way to New River; met a wolf, frequently waded waters; (took the whole journey on foot) had hard work swimming the James River; went up the Catawba twenty miles, no homes or houses; stopped at Justice Robinson's who owned a mill; crossed Catawba Creek twenty times. On November 19<sup>th</sup> I arrived just before noon and crossed the river to Jake Herman's who with his wife received us with great joy and love. November 20 preached on "I Am King John 18:23... Left on the 27<sup>th</sup> retracing our steps for Pennsylvania via the Valley German settlements."

St. Michael Lutheran Church established itself formally as a Lutheran congregation on October 16, 1796. The land upon which St Michael Lutheran stands this day was deeded to the church on August 5, 1806.

Through many good years and lean years; through name changes and pastoral changes; through years of war and years of peace; we come to our celebration in September.

By God's blessings on this parish, we have much to celebrate!



The story continues. Over the years, the nine Lutheran congregations in Montgomery County were yoked in a variety of parish alignments. From 1951 until 1968, New St. Peters, St. Marks, Shiloh and New Mt. Zion were joined as the New River Parish, served by one pastor. After much discussion as to the future of the parish, New St. Peter and St. Mark agreed to merge and assume the historic name of St. Michael Church. On September 15, 1968, St. Michael Lutheran Church became an active congregation, with services, at first, rotating between the two churches. The original property was acquired, and on August 9, 1970, ground was broken for the construction of the modern St. Michael Lutheran Church. The sanctuary, with a wing for offices and classrooms, was dedicated on May 16, 1971.

In the fifty years since the formation of the congregation, St. Michael has lived out its calling through expanded worship opportunities, through new facilities and through community partnerships which help people in need. When the congregation formed, its ministry was supported by a sanctuary and small support building. Today, the fellowship hall and classroom addition provide additional space, which allows St. Michael to offer a Mother's Morning Out program, to provide an Early Childhood Head Start partnership, and to offer meeting rooms to community groups. When the congregation was formed, it provided meals to families who were grieving or dealing with illness. Today, St. Michael partners with over 200 local community groups to operate Micah's Caring Initiative which provides over 300 weekend meals to hungry students in Blacksburg, operates a community garden which provides fresh produce for local food pantries, delivers meals to low-income seniors, donates new clothes at seasonal changes to students at Price's Fork Elementary School and offers dinner to the community on Thanksgiving Day. The on-going helping ministries of the congregation also include: the Christmas shoebox project for Head Start students on the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota, a Justice and Mercy Fund which assists an average of 20 families each month with living expenses, a fall collection of school supplies for Price's Fork Elementary School and a middle school mission trip.

We thank our charter members who worked so lovingly and diligently to create our worship home in 1968. Forty charter members still on the St. Michael roll will be recognized and honored at our Celebration Luncheon on September 16.
