This year's **Women of the ELCA Fall Gathering will be at St. Michael.** Sunday October 7, beginning with check in at 2:00 PM. Our theme this year is "Let Us Encourage" God's Children, they are our future. Our speaker Leah Shank, Acting Director of Development, Lutheran Family Services, will give us an overview of their programs for children. We will be working on several hands-on projects, things they will use daily. A separate list of needed materials will be available. St. Michael will provide refreshments. We welcome all the women to this once a year gathering where we can meet and enjoy visiting with women from other New River Valley Lutheran churches. Shoeboxes can be brought to the gathering, as well as to St. Michael until mid-November. Our offering this year will go to VSWO to help support women's programs in the US and around the world. We are all part of the larger group - Women of the ELCA. There will also be an offering to purchase materials for use at LFS Day Support Centers.

Looking Ahead - Christmas Shoeboxes: We are once again working with our ecumenical partner, Blacksburg Episcopal, to prepare Christmas shoeboxes for the Head Start Children at Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in SD. Lutheran churches in our area, Christ the King, Richmond and St. John, Lexington, SC also work with us to make boxes. The children are always excited to receive the shoeboxes which will be the only Christmas gifts for many of them. We will be collecting them until mid-November when we will prepare the boxes for shipping. Shoeboxes and info sheets will be available in the narthex.

Remember the Food Bank: In October please bring fixings for a Thanksgiving mealcanned vegetables, canned turkey gravy or packets, packaged potatoes, canned sweet potatoes, cranberry sauce, pumpkin pie filling, or dessert mixes etc., although any other non-perishable foods are always very much needed.
