One Simple Word: *revoco*

The work of the Reformation *only began* 500 years ago. The decade following the posting of the 95 Theses were filled with both political and theological drama. In the summer of 1518, legal proceedings in church courts began against Luther for his criticism of indulgences.

A Dominican cardinal and papal legate named Cajetan was sent to meet with Luther on October 12, 1518. His singular task was to have Luther to say one word - *revoco* - "I recant."

Luther refused to recart his positions and instead pressed Cajetan for clarity on where he was in error. Over the course of the three meetings on consecutive days from October 12-14, the theologically astute cardinal was unable to resist debate with Luther.

The central point of contention was the authority of the papacy to issue indulgences. Luther claimed the pope had no authority to institute a dogma teaching justification through any means other than Christ. When Cajetan pressed him on the point, Luther responded that popes, councils, and theologians can all err, Christ alone justifies. With each passing day of the hearing, the situation grew increasingly tenser and ultimately resulted in Cajetan sending Luther on his way with the demand to recant or face the consequences.

The Papal letter threatening Luther with excommunication was published two years later on June 15, 1520, calling Luther a "wild boar from the forest." Upon receiving the letter, Luther did not offer a defense. Instead, on the sixtieth day after its receipt, by which time he was to stand trial or be excommunicated, Luther ceremonially burned it, essentially rejecting the authority of the pope.

Women from six ELCA churches in the NRV met at St. Michael Sunday October 7th for the annual Fall Gathering. Leah Shank, Acting Director of Development for Lutheran Family Services, told us about their Day Support Centers. Our projects for the afternoon included making 56 sensory items out of fabrics, plastic soda bottles, covered plastic boxes, rice, coffee beans, etc. and we made slime! There were other items donated, such as modeling clay, fidgets and stress balls. We all enjoyed work and fellowship together. Pastor Wanda Childs led us in a Bible reading and discussion of the word Provoke. Using it in a positive manner, "Stirring the Pot" to accomplish good things. Those who attended brought Seventy-seven Christmas shoeboxes and a box of hand knitted stocking hats.



We are once again working with our ecumenical partner, Blacksburg Episcopal, to prepare Christmas shoeboxes for the Head Start Children at Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in SD. Lutheran churches in our area, Christ the King, Richmond, who sent 58 from their Gathering and St. John, Lexington, SC also work with us to fill boxes. The children are always excited to receive the shoeboxes; it is the only Christmas gift for many of them.


