BSA Troop 158

Nearly a hundred parents, guests, and Scouts turned out for Scouts BSA Troop 158's Court of Honor August. 22. The event was held in the Fellowship Hall of the Troop's charter organization, St. Michael Lutheran Church in Blacksburg.

More than 90 Merit Badges were awarded along with 27 rank advancements ranging from Tenderfoot to Life Scout. A special feature of the program was an interesting Q & A session by 6 young adults--all Eagles--shown in the photo below. These Eagles seated in the panel represent 6 of the 9 boys who earned the Eagle rank in Troop 158. Eagle is the highest rank a youth can earn in Scouting. It represents significant accomplishments in skills & leadership, and achieved only by about 5 % of the millions who have been and are BSA members. Recently, BSA opened their membership to include female members and changed the name from Boy Scouts to just Scouts. We now have several females, as well as males on the "Trail To Eagle" in T 158. Our Scouts are going GREAT!
