Greetings Dear Saints,

Valentine's Day occurs every February 14<sup>th</sup> across the U.S. and in other countries around the world. It is a time when couples exchange candy, flowers and romantic cards pledging their love to one another, all in the name of St. Valentine. But who is this mysterious saint and where did these traditions come from?

One of the many legends contends that Valentine was a priest who lived in third century in Rome during the time of Emperor Claudius II who decreed that single men made better soldiers than those with a wife and family. In order that his army be strong, the emperor outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, believing the decree to be unjust, went against Claudius and performed marriages for young lovers in secret. When Claudius discovered what Valentine was doing he ordered him to be put to death.

Perhaps the day belongs to bishop Valentine of Terni who has many stories attributed to his name. One such story, hearing two lovers quarreling, Valentine offered them a rose and begged them to hold it between their hands together without being pricked by its thorns. After some time they returned and asked him to join them in marriage.

Another story is of a Valentine who helped Christians escape harsh Roman prisons where they were often beaten and tortured. After being imprisoned himself, he sent the first "valentine" card after falling in love with the jailer's daughter who would visit him often. Before his death, it is alleged, that he wrote her a letter signed, "From your Valentine," an expression that is still in use today.

Around Valentine's Day every year the lectionary gives us a lesson on love. Jesus, through the gospel of Matthew 5:20–37, gives us a gift of four love lessons. These lessons are not your usual sweet and sentimental Valentine, but are real life directions for better relationships. Jesus says love shows **no hostility**, is **not predatory**, is **faithful**, and is **unconditionally truthful**. This kind of love comes about when we act on Christ's behalf to extend "God's love" to others.

Paul tells us in 2 Corinthians 5:20 that "we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us." God's appeal is that of "reconciliation" in order to end our estrangement from God and from another. As ambassadors we have been entrusted with this message of love, God's true love. Therefore, we are to live our lives in healthy loving relationships that respect the dignity of all people. We are to tell others of God's love, allowing our lives to be examples of that same love. In addition, we are to teach that love through Christ's life, death, and resurrection found in scripture.

Jesus spends the entirety of his ministry teaching us how to live as God's children with the hope that our love would be revealed to a hurt and dying world, and that they would know we are his followers. By this, people will come to know Christ.

May we, at St Michael, be a people who lean into that same love that Jesus taught in order to be a church where true love is revealed.... the love of God found in Christ Jesus our Lord.

# Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 26, 2020

### State Champion Tree – by John Kell

A tree on the St. Michael Lutheran Church grounds has been declared a state champion.

A Korean Evodia tree has been recognized as one of the largest of its species by the Virginia Big Tree Program, on-line at <a href="http://bigtree.cnre.vt.edu/">http://bigtree.cnre.vt.edu/</a> Use the 'search big trees' box to look for Korean evodia.

Trees earn points based on height, trunk circumference, and canopy diameter. Every foot of height earns 1 point, every inch of trunk circumference earns 1 point, and every foot of canopy diameter earns ½ point. The tree at the church is 66 feet tall, 46 inches in circumference, and has a canopy that is 40 feet wide (for 10 pts.) earning a total of 122 points.

Another Evodia tree on Burruss Street in Blacksburg has 125 pts. Since these two trees are within three points of each other, and since precision measurements are not easy to come by when measuring something uniquely shaped as a tree, these two trees are considered co-champions.

Korean Evodia is native to China and Korea. It flowers profusely in July so is much sought after by bees at that time of year, as not a lot of other trees are in bloom then. The seeds are hard and spherical, and remind some people of BB shot, so the tree is also known as Bee Bee Tree.

The previous state champion can still be found next to M&M Tire on Prices Fork Road.
