Greetings Dear Saints,

Welcome to the season of Lent! The word "Christian" appears in the New Testament only twice. The word "disciple" occurs 269 times. "Discipline" and "disciple" come from the same root. To be a disciple is to be a person of discipline. To pay attention. To focus. ELW's "Invitation to Lent" announces to the congregation on Ash Wednesday, "As disciples of the Lord Jesus we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, works of love, self-denial, quiet meditation—the disciplines of Lent—help us to wage our spiritual warfare. I invite you, therefore, to begin on this solemn first day of Lent to recommit yourselves to this struggle."

This understanding reinforces a sense of Lent as a time of preparation for personal and collective transformation. Having nurtured ourselves through Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, Lent becomes the time to look truthfully at ourselves and make changes.

The Church has a custom of not speaking or singing the word "Alleluia" during Lent. Based on the Hebrew word, halleluyah, meaning "Praise the Lord," alleluia has been a word of great praise to God in the life of the church and was prominent in early Christian liturgies. It is a joyful proclamation, which we put away during the more contemplative season of Lent. Putting it away for Lent is like putting away a favorite toy for a while to appreciate it better later.

To help our children better understand why we don't speak or sing the word "Alleluia" we cut out the letters from poster board and decorated each letter with signs of spring and resurrection during Families of Faith in early February. Then we said "say goodbye" to the Alleluia during the Children's Sermon on February 23. We symbolically buried it beneath a black sheet under the alter where it will lay dormant until Easter morning.

May this black mound of clothe under the altar become a dose of reality reminding us we are mortal and we are sinful. In our self-examination, the deeper we look inside ourselves, the more brokenness we discover. Lent drives us inward in-order to drive us outward to the saving work of Christ, accomplished in the cross and resurrection.

May our Lenten journey be a call to discipline and renewal and a gracious invitation to "return to the Lord our God." This is where we belong as children of God. On Easter morning may the Alleluia resound from our hearts and fill the church knowing we have been redeemed.
